Mary Anna welcomed the group and welcomed new member Raylene Keating.

Ginger led the group through a short tutorial on use of the Zoom screen sharing feature which had been an attachment to the meeting notice, saying the most important thing is to have the document/picture already open and accessible on your computer screen.

Ginger took a quick poll of those who desired the Zoom meeting length be 1 ½ hour long, receiving unanimous vote (as opposed to a 2-hour timeframe). Ginger noted that the group might want to meet longer when it is possible to meet in-person. Should some topics need revisiting or not fit into the meeting, the group was asked to consider individual questions on specific topics be "off'line" with mentor's volunteering to assist.

April Facilitator Sharyl McCulloch said the focus for the April meeting will be Chapter 3, p. 71-83.

Program/study Items:

Sandy led the group through study topics of balance of Chapter 2, Inventive Weaving on the Little Loom, referring to her attachment of topics/resources sent out with first meeting notice.

Topics receiving discussion:

- 1. Discussion about how to separate multiple items (such as dish towels) using same warp.
- 2. Various types of "sampling" for color, sett, shrinkage etc. and uses for the samples. Lynn recommended Janet Dawson's video on sampling and shrinkage

- 3. Lease sticks and how to use them in RHL weaving. Mary Anna and Randee to consult and potentially develop or recommend video on this subject, to be shared at April meeting.
- 4. Decreasing angle of shed toward end of weaving project, and options for tools to solve the problem.

Show-and share items

- Sharyl shared pictures of her "Wrapestry" piece from inspiration to finish, emphasizing her "hybrid" warping to multi-pegs then using horizontal spreader bar to keep tension while warping.
- Randee shared pictures of her multi-warp-yarn scarf, and challenges she overcame.
